This guide was developed by Multi-Agency Partnerships (MAP) of Allen County, Ohio- a collaborative funded by a Ohio's Employment First Initiative grant.  
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Transition is a time of change. Students with disabilities benefit from focused transition planning during their high school years so that they may develop and achieve their goals. Transition planning should begin early and addressed yearly in the students' Individualized Education Program (IEP).

Some of the services that will support them include area agencies with resources that they may not have had contact with yet.

This guide is intended to assist school personnel, individuals and their families/guardians with information to address basic needs of education, employment, and independent living.



# **Education**

After graduation from high school, students with documented disabilities are able to receive accommodations as needed on an individual basis. The students must self-identify with the school's disability services' office.

# **Employment**

**(OOD) Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities**, also known as BVR, houses the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation. This program provides individuals with disabilities the services and support necessary to help them attain and maintain employment. Disabilities may include physical, intellectual, mental health, visual or hearing impairments.

**Ohio Means Jobs, Allen County** provides specific services for youth ages 14-24, who seek employment yet face barriers. They provide Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program (CCMEP) that includes both the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity (WIOA) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) youth programs.

# **Transportation**

**Allen County RTA** - aims to improve the quality of life through mobility by providing transportation services for those who might not otherwise be able to arrive at shopping, medical appointments, work and entertainment in a timely manner. Wheelchair accessible, bike carrier and uplift services.

**Area Agency on Aging** – with advance notice can help to accommodate transportation needs if there is a documented disability. Wheelchair accessible vehicles available upon request.

**Lyft** -An unlicensed taxicab service that uses a mobile app for securing rides in vehicles owned by contracted drivers.

**Black and White Taxi** – Cab service open 24 hours a day. Wheelchair accessible.

**Capabilities, Inc.** – service provider offering driver assessment and training for license.

# **Supports for Counseling and Mental Health**

**Mental Health and Recovery Services** – Resource HUB for local prevention and treatment services.

**Family Resource Center (FRC)** – Specialized behavioral health services to individuals, children and families.

**SAFY (Specialized Alternatives for Families and Youth)** - Coordinated community-based programs that ensure the physical and emotional safety of each individual while improving family functioning.

**Coleman Professional Services**- Provider of behavioral health, addictions and rehabilitation programs that improve the lives of individuals and families.

**Lima UMADAOP** - Provides counseling, intervention and referral services; prevention and treatment programming for individuals. Increasing the awareness sensitivity of human service providers to the needs of Hispanic and African American consumers by providing culturally sensitive training and their families.

**PASS (Prevention Awareness Support Services)- (formerly PVFF)** Supports evidence-based programs in each of the prevention focus areas of child abuse, alcohol and other drugs, mental illness, suicide and problem gambling. Serving the community through the Mental Health and Recovery Board of Allen, Auglaize and Hardin counties.

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# **Independent Living**

**Health Partners of Western Ohio**- An independent, non-profit, community-directed organization serving low income and medically underserved communities. Services: Family doctor, Dental Pharmacy, Pediatric care, Life skills coaching- No one will be turned away because they are unable to pay.

**FCFC (Families and Children First Council)**- “Connects the dots” for families (with children up to age 18, or 21 with disability) who are in need of multiple services. Through family-centered service coordination, the ultimate goal is to enable families to function independently and increase their ability to be self-sufficient. Referrals may be made through an agency or directly by a family.

**Allen Metropolitan Housing Authority (AMHA)** – Federally funded public housing program to assist benefit eligible low-income families, seniors and people with disabilities.

**United Way 2-1-1**- Connects people with community resources and volunteer opportunities. The focus is to help you to find the right resource. It’s efficient, fast and easy to use. And the call is free and confidential.

**WOCAP (West Ohio Community Action Partnership)**- WOCAP offers many programs to help assist you in feeding, housing and raising children as well as bettering your living situation, education, and employment.

**DJFS (Department of Job and Family Services)**– Provides services such as food, cash and enlist for Medicaid, adult protection, child care and employment assistance.

**Legal Aid of Western Ohio**- Legal assistance for in civil matters for eligible low-income individuals to achieve self-reliance, equal justice and economic opportunity.

**Disability Rights Ohio** - The system under federal law designated to protect and advocate the rights of people with disabilities. They provide legal advocacy and rights protection to people with disabilities.

**Social Security Administration**- Assists with disability benefits SSI and SSDI application and resources.
